

Reusable Takeout Containers for Your Establishment









Why Reusables?

Take action on the Community Sustainability Reduce Waste. Currently 830,000 tons of plastic food containers are added to landfills each year in the US. Plastic containers take 500 years to breakdown & release greenhouse gases Reusables can reduce reliance on single use products, saving landfill space & creating a circular economy.

Consumers Desire to Participate


A consumer survey on current takeout container usage and reusable program interest circulated through Kalamazoo from January - March 2024. Data from the 1100 responses can be summarized as follows:

91% of respondents eat out at least 1 time per week

66% said they take home containers at least ½ of the time

34% interested in trying a new restaurant if reusables are offered

30,000 disposable containers could be saved from landfills per year if half of respondents (550 people) took home one reusable container per week





How Forever Ware Works for Consumers

1

Dine at any participating establishment

2

Request a Forever Ware container to go

Pay a \$5 fully refundable deposit per container or leave a card on file & enter your phone number to join the network.

4

Return Forever Ware container to **ANY** participating establishment

Next time you go to a participating location, return your container by scanning it and setting it in the bin. That's it!
The \$5 deposit/liability will automatically be returned to your Forever Ware account for future use!

Forget to bring it back? No worries, it happens to all of us!
There are no penalties for late returns, but the sooner you bring it back, the better container circulation will be.

Enjoy your food or drink

Afterwards, rinse your container in **cold water** - no soap necessary! Containers will be washed in commercial dishwashers upon return. Washing at home will only negate some of the positive environmental impacts of reusable containers. Let the professionals do the washing!



How Forever Ware Works for Businesses



What's Included?

- 30-200 Reusable containers of your choice
 - Insulated steel hot and cold mug with silicone lid: 12oz and 16oz
 - Steel food box with silicone lid: Large, Medium, Small (51oz, 34oz, 17oz)
- One device and app for staff to check containers out
- One device for customers to check containers back in
- Marketing posters, counter display, and table tents
- A staff training video is available in the app
- One-on-one staff support via email, text, phone, and app

Bee Joyful Shop will assist with container redistribution as needed

Forever Ware Costs

\$400 one-time start up fee\$50 per month software fee\$0.05 per use fee\$5 per container lease

\$5 per container is returned to you every time a new customer choses to use a reusable container at your establishment

The City's Support

A generous gift of \$9,000 was given to the City by the W.S. and Lois VanDalson Foundation to fund reusable takeout containers in Kalamazoo

\$8,250 to fund the first 15 food establishments (\$550 of funding per business)

\$750 towards City of Kalamazoo stickers for branding on containers & any misc. costs

\$400 one-time start up fee

\$150 for the first 3 months of software fees

How to Get Started

- 1
- <u>Connect with Forever Ware</u> to get your business added to the network
- Purchase container lease, startup fee, and pre-pay for 3 months of software fees
- Apply for a variance from the Kalamazoo County Health
 Department or MDARD depending on your type of establishment

- Fill out W-9 form and EFT form for reimbursement
 PDF in separate document

Submit Forever Ware receipt & variance letter & W-9/EFT forms to <u>Justin Gish</u>

\$550 reimbursement for the startup fee and 3 months of software fees will be on your way!
