"Documented public statements" means statements reported by the news media or written statements with a clear and unambiguous attribution to the applicant.

ELECTION INSPECTOR APPLICATION ADDENDUM

All election inspectors must be able to perform several essential job functions, including

- ✓ the ability to move, lift and assemble voting booths, ballot bags, and voting equipment with weights occasionally exceeding 30-pounds;
- ✓ the visual ability to read precinct lists, applications to vote, ballots, as well as other clerical work assigned by the Chairperson;
- ✓ the ability to deal with the public in a courteous, patient, and efficient manner; and
- ✓ the ability to sustain long periods of sitting and standing throughout the day, as the demands of voters may require.

Additionally, all election inspectors must be registered voters in the State of Michigan and must be willing to remain inside the polling room from 6:00 a.m. until dismissed by the Chairperson when work is completed after the 8:00 p.m. poll closing. In larger elections this could be as late as 11:00 p.m. The only exceptions to this requirement are for lunch and dinner breaks as permitted by the Chairperson.
